The 50th Anniversary Celebration turned out to be a wonderful event including the presentation of the colors by the Cortez NJROTC Color Guard, the Pledge of Allegiance, the beautiful performance of the National Anthem, the Invocation, the Memorial Table ceremony, the Toasts, the dinner, the remarks of Admiral Ryan, and the music. Those of us who attended will long remember the occasion. Thanks again to the 50th Committee and to all those who attended and to those who made donations which all made it a very appropriate memorial to the 50th anniversary of the Chapter.

As I reminded you last year, in November, we celebrate Thanksgiving Day which gives



us a chance to count our blessings, whether good health, family, friends, or whatever else. It also gives us an opportunity to help others who are in the same situation that many of us were in at some time in the past. This year we have a special opportunity to contribute to the ARNG Family Assistance Program.

This is a program set up by the Arizona National Guard to provide emergency assistance to families left behind by those Guard and Reserve members who have been called to active duty. They help the spouse with getting his/her car repaired, getting the water heater replaced, repairing storm damage, and all those things that the Guard or Reservist would have been able to handle if they had been home.

The Arizona Council of Chapters is conducting a fund drive for this cause which I endorse and encourage you to be a part of. I urge that you consider a generous contribution to the fund. Just remember the benefits which those of us who are now retired and those who will someday be retired have recently been awarded in large part to the efforts of MOAA. Tricare for Life results in a savings of over \$150/ month/ person. What a difference that amount could make to a Guard or Reserve family when

problems develop.

While the MOAA effort is being coordinated by the Council, credit will be given to each participant and to each Chapter. Please send your donations to the Arizona Chapter MOAA, 14435 North 66th Place, Scottsdale, AZ 85254. Write out your tax deductible check to "ARNG Family Assistance Program" and write on your check "AZ Chapter". The intent is to present a check to the National Guard on December 10th so make sure that you get your contributions sent in by December 5th to meet the deadline.

Legislative Update

Last month we reported that it would be touch and go whether or not the 2007 Defense Authorization Bill reconciliation between House and Senate got finished before the legislators departed for the campaign for midterm elections. MOAA national reports that they did indeed clear the conference report prior to adjourning. As was the case last year, we won some and lost some. All in all I think we have to chalk it up well on the positive side of the ledger. We owe a lot to our national headquarters staff in D.C. and to the Military Coalition for leading the charge and for our many members who sent in their cards and letters and made phone calls to show that grassroots support that is absolutely essential.

Among other things the bill bars the Defense Department from increasing any TRICARE Prime or TRICARE Standard fees, pharmacy co-pays or TRICARE Reserve Select premiums for FY 2007. This was a hard fought and significant victory over a surprise initiative out of DOD. We can expect it to be a battleground again for the FY 2008 budget cycle. The bill dropped a proposal to mandate use of the mail-order pharmacy for all refills of maintenance medications as well as MOAA supported initiatives to eliminate co-pays for most drugs dispensed through the mail-order system. It also authorizes permanent ID cards to permanently disabled dependents of retirees, and it requires a Pentagon report on giving members an option to have their Social Security numbers removed from ID cards.

The bill also increased Army, Army National Guard and Marine Corps end strengths and makes all drilling reserve members eligible for

TRICARE coverage at the lowest current premium. It provides \$400,000 Group Life Insurance (SGLI) free for members assigned to Iraq and Afghanistan and restricts unscrupulous lending practices by imposing a 36-percent annual interest rate cap on loans to service members.

On the negative side MOAA and other advocates were unable to sway the conferees into accepting the 2.7% active duty pay raise proposed by the Senate in lieu of the 2.2% raise proposed by the House. The bill does include some needed "targeting" of increases, but overall sends a pretty poor message to our war fighters. Both the MOAA advocated elimination of the DIC offset to SBP and the advanced cut-in date for 30-year paid up SBP also fell to the side in conference as they did last year. Also dropped were the Senate recommended reduction in Reserve retirement age and a provision to provide additional incentive payments to doctors to take TRICARE patients in areas with physician shortages.

We obviously have more work to do next year and there will always be more requirements than there are resources to fill them. MOAA spends considerable time and effort at year's end to identify and prioritize legislative actions for the following year. This year MOAA has conducted an outreach program to get inputs on interest from its members. There were 7000 surveys sent out to a random MOAA population, and the survey was available at the MOAA website through October 18. I hope that many of you took the opportunity to provide your opinions. We will keep you informed on priorities, issues and actions for next year as they become more settled over the coming weeks.

50th Anniversary October, 21 2006 - Wrap-up!!

October 21st marked the 50th Anniversary of the founding of our Chapter. That date is behind us, and a significant milestone in the life of the chapter has been achieved. It was a good 50 years and over the last few months we've reminisced fairly well. We mentioned people, activities, legislative successes, community involvement, scholarships and finances – five decades is a long time, and we remembered well. And we planned for the big day.

So, October 21st arrived with a lot of forethought. The basic considerations of "Who What Where When Why and How" had been in our minds, was scratched on napkins and envelopes, and finally committed to paper (or keyboards) over a very long time. Almost five years of anticipation and consideration was executed very well on October 21st.

Our Committee Chairperson, Chet Baumer conducted a casual campaign which ensured that each facet of "the plan" was addressed by individuals possessing the necessary competencies. From first "location" reconnaissance, to choice of menu, development of correspondence, invitation of guests and a Keynote Speaker, creation of a marketing plan and a project plan, promotional brochure and Press Release – and finally, the publication of the Program and the last minute tweaking of seating charts all came together with military precision! Go figure!

Our Keynote Speaker was none other than Vice Admiral Norb Ryan, President of MOAA. VADM Ryan actually arrived one day early and started Saturday with an early breakfast with Gary Fredericks and Bob Delker from the Arizona Council, and Chuck Schluter, a member of both the National Board and our Chapter. The plan for the day consisted of a kick-off breakfast, a visit to the Arizona National Guard, participation in the AZ MOAA Council of Chapters meeting, and finally, the Celebration of the Arizona Chapter

50th Anniversary.

The foursome did visit the Arizona National Guard headquarters and spent some time with Brigadier General Maxon, the Assistant Adjutant General, Army, and SGT George Murphy, a recently returned veteran of Operation Iraqi Freedom. The visit was extremely worthwhile for MOAA, and VADM Ryan was especially appreciative of the opportunity to learn first hand the needs of the families and the concerns of those currently serving. General Maxon is a long time member of MOAA, and he in turn appreciated the opportunity share his priorities as well.

The Arizona Council of Chapters meeting was well attended and well executed. An abbreviated agenda allowed the Council President, Gary Fredericks to distribute material and receive feedback from each Chapter. Chapters rendered separate reports which allowed VADM Ryan an opportunity to hear about unique issues, and especially, the unique activities our chapters conducted over the past several months. The Admiral's comments to the audience were extremely well received, not because the outlook from any particular vantage point was especially rosy (elections, a war, a tight budget, legislative matters, etc) but mostly because he is a genuine "people person" with a flair for humility that is extreme. Rest assured, the national president is totally dedicated to the MOAA mission, and to each individual member.

The Question and Answer session was informative (naturally) and was underscored by the insight we received, learning about how things unfold behind the scenes back at National Headquarters. You may recall that MOAA recently hosted an event where the President of the United States addressed an audience regarding the topic of Terrorism. How that came about, and how we scrambled to make things "just so" made for an interesting vignette indeed. Admiral Ryan then presented

MOAA's highest award, a Five Star Banner to both the Arizona Chapter and the Luke Chapter in recognition of their continued levels of excellence in 2005. The banners were accepted by the respective Chapter Presidents, Dan Conway and Jerry Wojtas.

The Council meeting concluded with an election of Officers who were duly sworn in as officers by VADM Ryan. Our Council is now in the capable hands of CW4 Bob Delker (President) from the Superstition Mountain Chapter, and Maj Vern Pall (Vice President) of the Tucson Chapter. Col Dick Weidner (Secretary/Treasure) from the Luke Chapter agreed to continue on as well.

As you can see – October 21st was shaping up to be a long, productive day. And thus far, everything was going according to plan!

Chapter members and guests, Admirals and Generals, Active Duty, Retired, Officer Candidates, Guard and Reserve, families and friends, sponsors and more seemed to float into the reception area right on time. The cocktail hour began promptly at 1730 and was a sea of well-suited men, uniforms and tuxedos, and the ladies were simply exquisite (of course!). Special Guests included VADM Ryan and his lovely wife Judy, Medal of Honor Recipient Fred Ferguson was accompanied by his bride Ann, Donna Adams represented the Unified Arizona Veterans, Col Palmatier came from the Arizona National Guard, and in total we were joined by 146 wonderful folks.

The evening agenda was concise, well executed, provided ample recognition of visitors, Chapters, Past Presidents and Hall of Fame inductees, but was noticeably short on speeches. Darn! We did conduct a special ceremony, led by Chapter VP Terry Tassin entitled the "Missing Man" to acknowledge our legacy, and those who could not, and will

never again partake of a military gathering. We also raised our glasses to toast our Commander in Chief, each service branch, the Public Health Service, NOAA and MOAA, and especially, our Ladies. Each toast was rendered by a representative of the respective service, and Terry ensured that our Ladies were honored appropriately.

Our President, Dan Conway kept things moving but never failed to provide words of recognition and credit to those who led the Chapter in the past, or those who made the evening event so worthwhile. He acknowledged the efforts of the committee. In retrospect, Frank and Velma selected the location and the band. They also donated every Table Center piece, and Frank created an extremely impressive and quite popular "Chapter History" display. Good counsel was provided by Jo Ann Thompson, Jim Seidl, Terry Tassin and Chuck Schluter – and all will acknowledge that the generous contributions of our members and sponsors over the last several years made the event possible, and quite special!

The Band, the Rags Allen Trio was marvelous, as was Beverly Poage who sang the Star Spangled Banner. Father Gerry Conway (brother of both Dan and Bernie) ensured we received ample blessings as he conducted a touching Invocation, and later a brief Benediction. Many things seemed to be happening all at once, and the plan for the evening, which took years to plan, was rushing to an end. Dan didn't miss a beat, and during one of his commentary moments, he looked over to table number four where eight members of the Toy family were enjoying their dinner with Bill Toy, our oldest surviving Chapter President (Bill turned 85 two weeks earlier than our 50th). Both Dan, and later, Admiral Ryan acknowledged that it was a continuous series of leaders, such as Bill, who have made the Chapter what it is, and led it to where it was that night.

Chuck introduced Admiral Ryan with emphasis upon the Admirals persona

and desire to engage the MOAA mission at the grass roots level. The Admiral quite obviously does conduct our business comfortably on the road, in the Halls of Congress and even in the Oval Office – however, it is his nature to be a Leader who is in touch with his constituents who are the individual members of MOAA. On this particular evening, every person touched by Judy and the Admiral were made to feel individually quite special. The impact of his presence and persona, and Judy's bright smile and sincere care for individuals combined to represent a true "force multiplier" for us. The impact was truly unimaginable at times. Wow! They made the evening event simply wonderful.

The Admiral's keynote address granted all present a rare look at how closely MOAA embraces the membership at large, and how the mission, to protect the entitlements of our uniformed services, their families and survivors, and our retiree's is foremost in all we do. He asked that the active duty member's present stand and they also received an ovation of applause. Dan was asked to return to the stage and the Admiral then presented the Arizona Chapter with a Certificate acknowledging 50 years of service to MOAA.

The evening was winding down, and the dancers were getting a wee bit antsy but we still had a surprise (two) up our sleeves. Dan called upon Col Palmatier to come forward, and Dan presented the Arizona Guard and Reserve Family Relief Fund with a check for \$1000. (We should have a separate article about that fund some day). He also requested that Admiral Ryan return front and center, and on the behalf of the Arizona Chapter, we presented a check for \$1000 to the MOAA National Scholarship Fund.

The Band initiated the dancing portion of the agenda with a medley of service songs, and as each branch song was played, respective members of the audience stood tall and received appropriate applause – it truly was a spectacular evening.

dance anymore – but it sure was a wonderful evening, and I wish I could do it again every month!


